Dear Friends,

The Lord Jesus Christ is RISEN! He has triumphed over sin, over death, and over hell! Alleluia! Alleluia!

Be not sad this day, no matter what, Jesus is LORD!

Every year I'm brought to tears from the words of the Easter Exsultet, so I felt it was right to share it as something to spend time praying with and letting the Lord minister to us through.

“Exult, let them exult, the hosts of heaven, exult, let Angel ministers of God exult, let the trumpet of salvation sound aloud our mighty King's triumph!

Be glad, let earth be glad, as glory floods her, ablaze with light from her eternal King, let all corners of the earth be glad, knowing an end to gloom and darkness.

Rejoice, let Mother Church also rejoice, arrayed with the lightning of his glory, let this holy building shake with joy, filled with the mighty voices of the peoples...

... is truly right and just, with ardent love of mind and heart

and with devoted service of our voice, to acclaim our God invisible, the almighty Father, and Jesus Christ, our Lord, his Son, his Only Begotten.

Who for our sake paid Adam's debt to the eternal Father, and, pouring out his own dear Blood, wiped clean the record of our ancient sinfulness.

These, then, are the feasts of Passover,
in which is slain the Lamb, the one true Lamb,
whose Blood anoints the doorposts of believers.

This is the night,
when once you led our forebears, Israel's
children,
from slavery in Egypt
and made them pass dry-shod through the
Red Sea.

and joining them to his holy ones.

when Christ broke the prison-bars of death

O love, O charity beyond all telling,
to ransom a slave you gave away your Son!
O truly necessary sin of Adam,
destroyed completely by the Death of Christ!

when Christ rose from the underworld!

This is the night
of which it is written:
